My tree is approximately 40 years old and came from Gossler's Nursery as a one-year graft. It took off beautifully and never looked back. It was a bit gawky at first but developed a perfect scaffolding that never needed correction. The only pruning involves taking out an occasional dead twig or a rare sprout. The tree remains very vigorous. It blooms profusely at first and then tapers off over a period of at least six weeks. I measured it recently: height is 28' 4" (8.6m), the spread is approximately 34' (10.4m), and the circumference is 37" (0.86m). The tree requires no attention whatsoever except from passersby who stop to admire the flower's beauty and rather intense fragrance.

MAGNOLIAS IN CORNISH GARDENS

tions and includes most of the *Magnolia* species and varieties, and a wide selection of cultivars, crosses, and hybrids. The illustrations show the buds and flowers, usually with details of the floral parts and often with fruit and were based on plants seen in gar-

dens, which are open to the public.

Each plate is accompanied by a description of the plant depicted on the plate. Each description includes the origin of the Magnolia and some of the features not shown on the plate, and an indication of the gardens where it can be seen. Many of the Magnolias grown in Britain are represented in Cornwall and the paintings and most of the text apply equally to Magnolias elsewhere.
